General Discussion:

***IPMS Flight 19 MODELFEST 2022 Contest:** Flight 19 has maintained its line of communication with the City of Pompano Beach and will now host **MODELFEST 2022 on March 5, 2022**, at the Emma Lou Olson Civic Center in Pompano Beach, Florida. Progress continues to be made "behind the scenes" such that all the preparations in place for the canceled Modelfest X 2021 will carry over to MODELFEST 2022. There will be no charge for walk-in admissions during MODELFEST 2022 in order to satisfy some non-profit requirements of the City of Pompano Beach related to the venue.

Peter Frearson, Chief Contest Judge, clarified at tonight's meeting that Modelfest 2022 on March 5, 2022, will award 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards. **Future club contests will use the Gold/Silver/Bronze award system beginning in 2023** after the club has had a chance to study and evaluate the pros and cons of that system when used at other contests in Florida.

The overall **Contest Theme for Modelfest 2022** will be anything to do with **"Comics."** A **"Koster" Category** has been added to the **Modelfest 2022** contest to honor our late member, Bill Koster. Any model designed by Bill while he was at Monogram/Revell Models or through his Koster Aero Enterprises (KAE) vac-formed model company will qualify for consideration in the "Koster" category. There will also be a special contest category for Supermarine Spitfire models due to 2021 being the 85th anniversary of the Spitfire fighter plane.

Butch Bryan is also working to see if we can get a speaker from the Fort Lauderdale Naval Air Station Museum to make a presentation on the history of Fort Lauderdale International Airport and its relationship to the US Navy, particularly during World War II. (President George H.W. Bush received some flight training at NAS Fort Lauderdale before deploying to the Pacific in WW II.) Details to follow in subsequent club meetings!

*SPECIAL NOTE: The 50th Anniversary of IPMS Flight 19 is 2023. Our Modelfest 2023 contest and show will honor the club's 50th Anniversary and, according to Butch Bryan, will also serve as the IPMS Region 11 contest for 2023.

***Flight 19 Christmas Party:** The members have voted in favor of having a Christmas party in December 2021. As is our usual practice, the date for the Christmas party will be set for either the first or second Friday in December. President East will coordinate with our host church, the First Church of the Nazarene, to set a firm date which will be announced on the Flight 19 Facebook page and in the minutes of our club meetings. Pizza and sodas will be served during the Christmas party and there will also be our traditional "Christmas Model Swap-And-Go." Other local model clubs are always cordially invited and expected to attend. Details will be published as soon as the date of the Christmas party is confirmed with the church.

*2021 IPMS National Convention/Contest in Las Vegas NV: Peter Frearson attended the recent IPMS Nationals in Las Vegas and gave a brief overview of the show. He said that, due to Covid-19 virus travel restrictions, there were no foreign based vendors present. That being said, the model display room was more than adequate with good lighting and sufficient display space. There was a good model turnout and we should look forward to seeing photos of them in the next IPMS Journal. The grand prize winner was a scratch-built Sikorsky CH-64 Skycrane in US Army markings. *Show & Tell:

Adam Weinstein: Adam is one of our most prolific car modelers and he can claim that title tonight, too. He brought two car models that he finished about two months ago that looked really good. Both kits were originally produced by Fujimi in 1/24 scale and included electric motors in the original issues; however, when they were re-boxed by other manufacturers the electric motors were eliminated. The first model was a Mercedes 190E that Adam finished in Avocado Green with white wheels. Obviously, it is one of his favorites and rightly so.



Adam's second car model was of a Tomaso Pantera that he finished in a purple color complemented by a black hood and body side trim that is actually a vinyl film, not paint. He said that he was really pleased with the effect and the ease of applying the black vinyl film to the model. Adam had problems with the primer paint and the purple topcoat paint. Regardless, the end result looks very good and no one would suspect the problems he encountered with the painting process. The kit comes with real rubber tires.




Meir Israel: Meir is experimenting with 3-D printing and it looks as though he's far along on the learning curve. Last month he brought in the raw pieces/parts that he had printed for a 1/72 space fighter as seen in the Disney animated "Mandalorian" series which is a follow-on to the "Star Wars" franchise. He purchased the software from Pocket Dimension Designs and re-sized the model to 1/72 scale. Overall, it took 19 hours to print all the resin parts of the model. Meir used Tamiya paints for the colors and Alclad metallic paints for the metal portions of the model.






Meir is also working on producing a prototype B-wing space fighter seen in "Star Wars." So far, he has printed out various sub-assemblies of the fighter and brought some of those pieces to tonight's meeting so club members could see them in the "raw." It will look great when it's eventually completed. It also looks to be a BIG model when it's completed.



John Montesinos: John "Madman" Montesinos is at it again! He's infatuated with the Monogram 1/48 scale P-47D kit and is in the process of completely rescribing it, including reproducing the rivet detail, and super detailing it. He states that he's really impressed with the effects produced when using AK metallic paints over black undercoats. The metallic effects look real and in scale, according to John. He's going to use an Eduard base that simulates Marsten matting and will include figures in his diorama. It should prove to be a satisfying experience for him and a visually stimulating one for the club members. We look forward to seeing the completed diorama at a future meeting.



Eric Gonzalez: Mr. Gonzalez is working on something unusual. He's scratch building a 1:1 model of the Proton Pack used in the "Ghostbuster" movies. Why? Because he's going to a costume party this Halloween as a Ghostbuster, that's why! He brought a miniature Ghostbuster figure to show what the final product will look like and the constituent pieces are in various stages of completion. Hope no ghosts show up at the party. LOL





Eric is also working on a Revell 1/24 scale model re-box of the Lincoln Futura concept car. He says that the kit is a bear due to it's age—nothing fits and it's taking a lot of time and putty to get it done. Still, it will look great when finished.



Eric has also been working to finalize his Moebius 1/144 scale model of the Discovery spaceship from "2001: A Space Odyssey." He's started the final stages of painting the exterior of the model and brought the "ball" section of the spaceship to show the subtle shading and various tones of color that he's trying to achieve on the exterior of the white model. Good work and lots of skill.



Butch Bryan: Butch Bryan has a goal—he wants to do a model of each variant of the P-51 Mustang in 1/48 scale. Currently, he's working on models of two early versions, both being Accurate Miniature kits--a "straight" P-51 (white nose) and a P-51A (red Nose). He says the kits are great and go together well with only the wing leading edge to fuselage joint posing a minor problem that is easily overcome. Acquiring the kits has been easier than he thought since Academy has re-boxed the Accurate Miniature 1/48 scale Mustang kits which means he has two sources to search for available kits. Butch is also using these models as a basis to experiment with weathering and paint effects. He's already incorporated oil washes and chipped paint effects on the models.



Jim Decker: Jim brought a couple of 1/48 scale P-47 Razonback models for show and tell. One is a Monogram kit (silver scheme) and the other is an Otaki kit (camouflage scheme). He used some Medallion Models resin conversion pieces to model various subtle differences between the kits and stated that he has a large supply of Medallion Models resin conversions in his "stash" at home. (Ed.—My recollection is that the Medallion Models resin conversions were not the easiest resin conversions to use, but they did offer the opportunity to do different Thunderbolt versions that were not readily available when Medallion was in business.) Jim is a very generous fellow and has donated some of his Medallion Models resin parts to John Montesinos so John can do some different P-47 Thunderbolt variants in the future.



Steven Blok: Steve likes to do models of Gundam figures. He brought his next project which is a work-in-progress. It's a 1/100 scale Bandai kit of an FA-010S Full Armor ZZ Gundam figure. He plans on basically doing it out-of-the-box since he and his late father were thinking of doing one just like this kit. One thing can be said: it is a big model, but Steve will do it justice!



Raffle Prize: Tonight's raffle prize was a Revell 1/32 scale kit of a P-51D-5NA Mustang along with a stand and clips for mounting alligator clips to hold and paint (or weld) small parts. The happy winner was one of our newest members, Meir Israel. Congratulations, Meir!
