The meeting was called to order by President Jeff East at 7:40pm.

NOTE: Attendance at tonight's meeting was hindered by extremely bad weather in south Florida, including lightning and heavy rain/thunderstorms

### **SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENTS:**

\*\*President Jeff East announced that, due to the disruptive effects of the Covid-19 pandemic, he has decided to delay his "retirement" as President of IPMS Flight 19; he is now stepping down, effective, January 2022. As with his predecessor, Peter Frearson, many years of dedicated service takes its toll on family and work (as well as mental health!). So, with perpetual gratitude and respect to Jeff, the club will have about five months to help someone decide to take over the presidential mantel in 2022. Jeff's not leaving, just going back to being a modeler and a member! His gesture in delaying his "retirement" is generous and will alleviate some of the pressure on the club regarding future officer elections and IPMS charter renewal.

**CHURCH COVID-19 PROTOCOL:** The First Church of the Nazarene has adopted face-to-face and social distancing protocols while the Covid-19 virus is still rampant in our community. **The club is now meeting in a different room at the church**—it is much larger and has better lighting than our traditional meeting room. The new room is on the east side of the church, next to the gymnasium. Many club members will recognize it as a spill-over room used for aircraft model displays during our previous contests held at the church. The new room makes it much easier

and more comfortable to comply with the church's Covid-19 protocols. It is possible that the church will relax its Covid-19 protocols in light of recent Centers for Disease Control (CDC) recommendations, BUT until we are notified by the church of any changes, the current face mask and social distancing protocols will remain in effect. The club meetings have been designed to conform with the face-to-face protocols as follow:

- \*All unvaccinated members will be required to wear face masks during the meeting, except when presenting their models during "show and tell"
- \*Long tables will be set up, sufficiently separated from seated club members, so members can set up and display their models for "show and tell" and maintain social distancing
- \*Member seating will be spaced apart by at least 6' and, if we are using an exceptionally large room, seating in separate rows will be staggered in order to maintain social distancing without obstructing anyone's view of the model table while they are seated
- \*No food allowed, but sodas and snacks such as candy bars can be consumed on premises

### 2021 REGIONAL CONTEST FOR IPMS REGION 11: IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Flight 19's Modelfest X 2021 was to be the 2021 Regional Contest for IPMS Region 11 originally to be held on Saturday, MARCH 6, 2021, at the Emma Lou Olson Civic Center in Pompano Beach, Florida. However, as previously announced, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, Modelfest X 2021 HAS BEEN INDEFINITELY POSTPONED. At this time, it is unlikely that Modelfest X 2021 will take place in 2021.

\*Model Contests: Generally, 2020 and most 2021 model contests have been canceled due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, although some contests are beginning to advertise contest dates and places (see listing, above). The first 2021 contest in Florida was the JAXCON which was held on April 10, 2021, in Jacksonville, Florida. Modelpalooza is planned for October 22-24, 2021, in Kissimmee, Florida.

Our Modelfest X 2021 Region 11 contest has been indefinitely postponed due to the pandemic and, in all probability, will not be held in 2021. Flight 19 will maintain its line of communication with the City of Pompano Beach and will reschedule Modelfest X 2021 if a firm date can be confirmed by the City of Pompano Beach that will not conflict with any other potential 2021 contests in Florida. However, there is no guarantee that Modelfest X 2021 will be held during 2021 and, at this time, it appears unlikely to be held in 2021.

\*MODELFEST 2022 Contest: Despite the fact that Modelfest X 2021 has been indefinitely postponed because of the Pandemic, IPMS Flight 19 will host MODELFEST 2022 on March 5, 2022, at the Emma Lou Olson Civic Center in Pompano Beach, Florida. Progress continues to be made "behind the scenes" such that all the preparations in place for the postponed Modelfest X 2021 will spill over to MODELFEST 2022. Peter Frearson, Chief Contest Judge, announced during our July 2021 meeting, subject to member approval, that starting with MODELFEST 2022, judging will switch to a Gold/Silver/Bronze award system instead of 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place awards. Last month a discussion followed Peter's announcement regarding the pros and cons of each award system and the club voted to adopt the Gold/Silver/Bronze award system beginning with MODELFEST 2022. In addition, there will be no charge for walk-in admissions during MODELFEST 2022 in order to satisfy some non-profit requirements of the City of Pompano Beach related to the venue. These changes will be addressed and refined in future club meetings. It was also agreed that each member would donate one "good" model kit to be added to the MODELFEST 2022 kit raffle stash.

Butch Bryan has previously announced that a 3-D printer has been donated for the Modelfest X 2021 raffle and that will be shifted to MODELFEST 2022. THAT should generate a lot of interest in the contest by itself! He also said that he is making good progress in getting sponsors for the contest. A **"Koster" Category** has been added to the contest to honor our late member, Bill Koster. Any model designed by Bill while he was at Monogram Models or through his Koster Aero Enterprises (KAE) vac-formed model company will qualify for consideration in the "Koster" category. The overall **Contest Theme** will be anything to do with **"Comics."** There will also be a special contest category for Supermarine Spitfire models due to 2021 being the 85<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Spitfire fighter plane. Butch Bryan is also working to see if we can get a speaker from the Fort Lauderdale Naval Air Station Museum to make a presentation on the history of Fort Lauderdale International Airport and its relationship to the US Navy, particularly during World War II. (President George H.W. Bush received some flight training at NAS Fort Lauderdale before deploying to the Pacific in WW II.) Details to follow in subsequent club meetings!

\*Jeff East: Jeff is still looking for someone to return his \$100 book on aircraft modeling. As you may recall, it was being circulated among various club members, but it hasn't appeared in a number of months. Whoever is in possession of Jeff's book, please get in touch with him to make arrangements to return it to him.

#### \*Show & Tell:

Lynn Delacroix: Lynn, our resident creative artist, believes in lifelong education and takes various academic courses to inspire her creativity and stimulate her mind. One of her professors had an assignment to design something in the shape of an "X" that was creative, inspiring and was made of wood. Lynn jumped on that one and designed what might be called a Pyrotechique Tower. Obviously, it has an "X" shape and it's made of wood—and wood matches! It's desgined to have flames climb one side of the "X." We took it outside to "light the fire," but the matches were slightly damp due to the crappy weather that we had been experiencing and would not ignite. None of the club members had a cigarette lighter, so the fire show was postponed. Here are a few photos of her design.





Jeff East: President (possibly for life) East brought a work-in-progress (WIP) Accurate Miniatures 1/48 scale P-51 model. Jeff said, in his opinion, that the kit, which was the first one put out by Accurate Miniatures, was not really well designed. The fuselage, instead of being full left and right vertical sides, has a front to back matching design. That makes getting rid of seam lines harder as well as requiring precise alignment. Jeff used Mike Skurda's idea and previously made a homemade, small rotary sander out of a battery-powered electric toothbrush where flexible disks of varying sandpaper grades could be used. The advantage of flexibility is that disks can conform to curved surfaces. It made aligning and removing seam lines easier than hand sanding. That being said, he still felt that kit required excessive sanding. On the other hand, he felt that the cockpit interior was well designed and looked good when assembled. One of Jeff's quests is to use brown tinged olive drab paint (as opposed to green tinged olive drab paint). He used such an olive drab paint from the Vallejo China-Burma-India paint collection and was quite satisfied how the color looks on the model. We look forward to seeing the completed P-51 next month!






Mark Mirin: Mark brought two WIP models to the club tonight. The first is the Supermodel (from Italy) 1/72 scale Blohm and Voss BV-138 Luftwaffe seaplane from WW II. It is a most unusual trimotored seaplane, although there have been some modern turboprop seaplanes based on a similar design from Germany. The plane was used for search and rescue missions during WW II so it was a blessing for any downed airman to see one in flight. Mark said that the instructions

were terrible. While there were part numbers on the diagrams in the instructions, there were no part numbers embossed on the plastic sprues! In addition, the kit plastic is very soft and can be hard to work with. He lost the kit decals, but that doesn't matter since he thinks they would have been useless anyway. Instead of using the clear plastic porthole windows supplied in the kit, Mark used white glue. Those windows came out very clear and look realistic. Mark chose to do this kit, because he really likes the tri-motor configuration and the twin booms.






Mark's 1/35 scale Trumpeter HEMTT Combat Fire Truck kit is progressing well, although Mark says it's not the perfect kit for anyone who hasn't built a kit in 30 years! He's decided to progress through the build by adopting a "module" mentality. The theory is to build a number of individual modules that end up being combined to create the finished model. He also said that he is working with photo-etched (P/E) parts for the first time and that he feels they will really enhance the finished model. One problem area relates to colors, exterior and interior: the instructions do not identify any specific colors or paint brands that should be used on the model. On the other hand, Mark praised Trumpeter's customer service. He needed some replacement and extra sprues for this and one other project and contacted Trumpeter to obtain those sprues. He had no problem ordering them, paid for them using Paypal and they were shipped quickly from China to his home. Good for Trumpeter! Each month, Mark gets a little closer to finishing this unique fire truck.









Adam Weinstein: Last, but not least, are Adam's models which are always creative and unique! The first is a metal diecast kit by ABC Briance, an Italian company, in 1/43 scale of a Hispano Suiza K6 transporter from the 1930's that was used to transport race cars. It is available from Model Expo for about \$80. According to Adam, the instructions are terrible and there are only about 25 parts in the kit! He is also using some very small P/E parts and has replaced the headlights with clear crystals that he purchased from a Michaels' store. The prototype transporter was painted white, but Adam opted for a metallic blue/lavender color that looks very good on the model.






Adam's next model is a 1/24 scale 3-D printed model by Ice Man Collections of an electric dirt bike racer. It took him about an hour and a half just to carefully remove the parts from the 3-D sprue before he began construction. It is a very fragile, small kit when completed and that is why Adam attached the dirt bike to the base. Decals came from a friend of his who makes custom decals and they really complement the finished model.







The last model presented by Adam is the result of his reading about a supposed conspiracy of the Chinese to build missile launching cargo containers that are non-descript and unassuming. The conspiracy plot is that they will be placed in Walmart and shopping mall parking lots and missiles would be launched by remote control by the Chinese to attack the US. Ain't the Internet great? Far-fetched, but worthy of a model by Adam! He used an Italeri/Revell 1/24 scale 48' cargo container model along with a Revell History Maker 1/40 scale kit of a Bomarc missile on a launcher to create his missile launcher conspiracy model. Unusual in the extreme, but still interesting. Good work Adam! Don't forget to duck and cover....
