The meeting was called to order by President Jeff East at 7:45pm

*SPECIAL NOTE: The 50th Anniversary of IPMS Flight 19 is 2023. Our Modelfest 2023 contest and show will honor the club's 50th Anniversary and, according to Butch Bryan, will also serve as the IPMS Region 11 contest for 2023. The tentative date for Modelfest 2023 is Saturday, March 4, 2023. Butch Bryan, the wayward Okie from near Muskogee, will be handling the model raffle for Modelfest 2023. He will also be coordinating with IPMS-USA for such things as regional contest requirements, etc., in connection with Modelfest 2023.

Modelfest 2022 Update:

Financial figures should be finalized and disclosed at the June 2022 meeting, but it appears that the club did have a positive outcome, after all expenses, from Modelfest 2022. Final financial figures are not yet available—some of the expenses have yet to be billed; e.g., the final bill for the trophies has yet to be received. Despite these pending expenses, the club finances remain solvent and it appears that there will also be a positive gain from Modelfest 2022 when final figures are determined.

Modelfest 2023 Update:

Pompano Beach Civic Center: President East and Butch Bryan report that, at this time, the Pompano Beach Civic Center is still going to implement a 90-day maximum lead time for committing to lease the Civic Center premises for future events. This limitation is NOT feasible for any future Modelfest contest/show, because a longer lead time is needed to get such things as commitments from vendors, to have trophies manufactured and to prepare and disseminate advertising, etc. The City of Pompano Beach is willing to offer an alternative venue for Flight 19's future Modelfest contests/shows which will have longer lead times for committing to lease the

facilities, but none of those possible sites is large enough or suitable for holding a regional contest. Consequently, the club is looking for a different venue that is suitable for Modelfest 2023. President East hopes to announce a new venue by next month's meeting in order to move forward with a Modelfest 2023 contest/show.

Book Sale Results: JT Occhialini reported that the club netted \$119 from the sale of aviation related books donated by Ed Ludwick through sales at club meetings and at Modelfest 2022. JT gave an envelope containing the book proceeds to President East at tonight's meeting. Remaining, unsold books will be donated to the local Plantation City Library.



General Comments:

*Eric Olson relayed a message from Jeff Selker of the Model Car Creations car model club. MCC recently came into possession of numerous kits, mostly of aircraft, through the generosity of the widow of a long-time modeler. In the near future, Jeff says that MCC will bring various kits to Flight 19 meetings to sell to members at very reasonable prices. More later as this develops....

*Show & Tell:

Danny Price: Danny tends to build cars and planes so it's no surprise that he brought his Hobby Boss 1/72 scale Do-335 Arrow German WW II fighter to the meeting. It's a work-in-progress (WIP), but it's practically finished. He says he built the model as an experiment in weathering aircraft. He used Tamiya paints, painting "dots" then smearing them with enamel thinner before cleaning them up with cotton Q-tips. Danny also used photo-etched parts for the delicate antennae, detailed the gear doors and completed the rather bare wheel wells. Lead weight was glued into the nose with wood glue to keep the Do-335 from being a tail-sitter and he used weighted tires to simulate a heavy airplane. On the way to this stage, Danny had to strip the original paint scheme and found a great paint stripper—totally "awesome," per him, at The Dollar Store. It works well and doesn't harm the plastic. As a side note, it took three years for Danny to get this project to its present stage! Keep up the good work now that it's almost finished!



Giuseppe Santaromita: Giuseppe is one of our newest members and he brought his Eastern Express 1/72 scale Mig-31 which is at the primer stage. He said it's not a very good kit, because it is hard to build. So far it's taken 18 months for him to get it to the primer stage. Regardless, it looks good, so far, and we look forward to seeing it completed in the near future!





Dillon LeBlanc: We've practically seen Dillon grow up since he started coming to Flight 19 when he was a young teenager. One practical benefit is that we've also seen how his modeling skills have improved and evolved as he's matured, too! He likes to build airplanes and tonight he brought two models for display. The first is AFV's 1/48 scale F-5E jet fighter which he did in the markings for US Navy aggressor squadron VFC-111 (NAS Key West). Dillon says it is a nice kit and he added sidewinder air-to-air missiles and an instrumentation pod to the model.



Dillon's second model is the Kinetic 1/48 scale kit of an IA-58 Pucara ground attack fighter used by Argentina during the Falklands conflict in 1982. He says it is a great kit, even at the primer stage, and he's waiting on special paints to arrive so he can paint it in the Falklands war scheme. He intends to "team" the Pucara with a 1/48 scale RAF Harrier GR.3 from the same conflict.



Jim Decker: It was good to see Jim at tonight's meeting since he's been recovering from some unforseen medical issues. He brought what he thinks is a Korean copy of a 1/32 scale Hasegawa F-5E jet fighter that he previously built and mounted in an "in flight" mode. He said the kit copy was not a good kit from a builder's perspective, unlike most Hasegawa kits in this scale. He made the display base out of scrap plexiglass and used epoxy glue for the base. It all came together well and looks great now!



Eric Gonzalez: Mr. Gonzalez brought four models for display at tonight's meeting. All of them have some Sci-Fi connection, so here goes! First up is the Polar Lights 1-1000 scale "Star Trek" Shuttle Carrier with additional PNT resin parts. It's ready for decals.



The second of three space ships is the Multi-Verse Models 1-1000 scale Phobos class frigate from the "Star Trek" movie franchise. It has a pearlessence paint finish on the saucer portion of the model.



The final space ship in this trilogy is pretty familiar. It's the C57D flying saucer from the "Forbidden Planet" movie by Polar Lights in 1/144 scale! Eric intends to take this model to the Wonderfest contest/show in Louisville KY in June. He's lighted it and had made the landing legs retractable. Many of us think it will be an award winner!



Eric's figure entry tonight is a depiction of Peter Parker (as played by Toby Maguire) from the "Spiderman" movie franchise. It's a 1/12 scale vinyl figure body with a resin Toby Maguire head that Eric mounted on the vinyl body. Mr. Gonzalez is building this figure for a friend of his who we suspect will be quite pleased with the final product!



RAFFLE: Tonight's raffle prize was a choice between two different kits and the happy winner, Butch Bryan, chose the Tamiya 1/24 scale kit of the Nissan Fairlady Z (300ZX 2-seater). Congrats to Butch!

The following is the narrative of the obituary for John D. Ficklen, III, that appeared in the March/April 2022 issue of the IPMS/USA Journal:

JOHN D. FICKLEN

John Davenport Ficklen III, of Griffin, GA, and formerly St. George Island, FL, passed away on February 8, 2022, at Brightmoor Hospice, Griffin, GA. He was born May 20, 1941 to Colonel John D. Ficklen, Jr., and Catherine Copeland Ficklen. John graduated from the University of Georgia in 1963, and entered naval flight training at Pensacola, FL. He flew anti-submarine warfare helicopters during his active duty. Following his naval career, John joined Eastern Airlines, where he flew for 23 years retiring as a captain. During his flight career, John was also recognized as an award-winning model ship and model airplane builder and a member of the International Plastic Modelers Society. John is also known for his detailed aviation art, which included numerous limited-edition prints personally signed by historical pilots, ranging from WW I to the Vietnam era. John's models and his artwork are in private collections and museums throughout the country. John was also known for his restorations of private aircraft, as well as his award-winning wooden boat, "Babe." His final extraordinary creation was his scratch built Pietenpol airplane, which he enjoyed flying while living in Florida.

John is survived by his wife of 60 years, Susan Brown Ficklen; his son, John Davenport Ficklen, IV, (Jennifer), Kennesaw, GA; daughter, Jennifer Elizabeth Ficklen (Brendan O'Connor), Glenmoore, PA; son, Judson Albert Ficklen (Gina), Griffin, GA; six grandchildren and four great-grandchildren; two sisters, Catherine Davis (Temperance Davis, III), Albany, GA; and Mary Lyon Jarman, Marietta, GA.

IPMS was a huge part of his life and my family's life as he created and built some outstanding and award-winning models over the 50-plus years he was an IPMS member. He and his talent will be greatly missed.
